Course Description:

The topics covered in Advanced Music Theory include, but are not limited to: music notation, ear training, composition analysis, major and minor scales, key and time signatures, intervals, and sight singing.

Topics will include:

Aural skills through listening examples from a variety of time periods and genres. Sight-Singing Skills through performing alone and with others Written skills through composing 2,3, and 4 part exercises Compositional skills through the use of written chord progressions as well as melodic and harmonic lines Analytical skills through analyzing a variety of music compositions

Unit 1: Music Fundamentals I - Pitch, Rhythm, Meter, Expressive Elements, Major Scales and Major Key Signatures - Sight Singing

Unit 2: Music Fundamentals II - Minor Scales and Key Signatures, Melody, Timbre, and Texture - Sight Singing

Unit 3: Music Fundamentals III - Triads and Seventh Chords - Sight Singing

Unit 4: Harmony and Voice Leading I: Chord Function, Cadences, and Phrasing - Dictation **Unit 5**: Harmony and Voice Leading II: Chord Progressions and Predominant Function -Dictation

Unit 6: Harmony and Voice Leading III: Embellishments, Motives, and Melodic DevicesUnit 7: Harmony and Voice Leading IV: Secondary Function - Sight Singing and DictationUnit 8: Modes and Form - Sight Singing and Dictation

Course Requirements:

This is an advanced music theory course that will enhance prior music learning and understanding. All projects and assignments must be completed to receive a passing grade. Ample time will be given. All projects and assignments will be executed in the given class

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period. There will be tests, quizzes, and at home practice. If absent, students are encouraged to reach out to Miss Fencik for what work was missed. All work is posted on Canvas.
